

<b>1000 Lakes Scholarship</b>	The purpose of this scholarship is to support the higher education of students throughout the Itasca Area School Districts.
<b>Alan Seagren Memorial Scholarship</b>	Pursuing an education to become a conservation officer.
<b>Ardell Simonson Memorial Scholarship</b>	The Ardell Simonson Memorial Scholarship is intended for a graduate of a Greater Itasca Area high school who achieves a minimum GPA of 2.5 or greater who is interested in becoming an Elementary Educator.
<b>Barbara Swentkofske Memorial Scholarship</b>	Graduating Grand Rapids HS, Female planning to attend a Community College or 4-Yr College or University
<b>Betty Shannon Scholarship (CSS and ICC)</b>	There are two 2-year recurring scholarships that support students who study nursing at (1) College of St. Scholastica and (2) Itasca Community College.
<b>Bigfork Lions Scholarship</b>	A 2-year recurring scholarship that supports students graduating from Bigfork School.
<b>Bill and Ruth Powers Scholarship</b>	For students with a "B" grade point average (3.0) or better, who have enrolled in a two-year or four-year college or technical school to pursue a major in the field of arts and humanities.
<b>Bill Gray - Southwest Elementary Scholarship</b>	To support students who attended Southwest Elementary School. Top ranking academic students are not eligible for this award.
<b>Bill Prigge Scholarship</b>	For a graduating Greenway senior who is planning to attend a post secondary school with an emphasis in business or economics. Must have a GPA of 2.5 or better.
<b>Bob Frick Memorial Scholarship</b>	Intended for a student entering a vocational/technical program. Priority may be given to a graphic arts student.
<b>Bonner Hockey Scholar Award</b>	This award is presented to the GRHS male and female hockey player with the highest cumulative GPA on their respective hockey team.
<b>Brad Smith Memorial Scholarship</b>	The recipient of this scholarship will demonstrate Brad's values of commitment to self and community through involvement and dedication.
<b>Burgess Family Scholarship Fund</b>	The Burgess Family Scholarship is offered to a student graduating from Deer River High School who plans to earn a Bachelors Degree. The applicant must have a minimum GPA of at least 3.0, and be active in community service. The award is provided as 1/2 the first year and 1/2 after the recipient's sophomore year, contingent on progress toward success.
<b>Carl &amp; Margaret Mickelson/Kiwanis Scholarship</b>	This scholarship supports GRHS Key Club (or Circle K) students who demonstrate commitment to community service.
<b>Catherine Anderson Memorial Scholarship</b>	This scholarship supports females who are interested in pursuing a career in education.

<b>Chad, Holly and Hannah Davis Memorial Scholarship</b>	This scholarship supports students who are attending, or have attended, District 318, 316 or who have been homeschooled and are enrolling in a vo-tech or 4-year college/university. Student can be a high school senior or nontraditional student. IEP is preferred, but not required.
<b>Coach Ted Brill Hockey Scholarship</b>	This scholarship is offered to a male hockey player who demonstrates the values of hockey and commitment to community and education.
<b>Coach Tom Drazenovich Scholarship</b>	This scholarship recognizes a GRHS Senior football team member who demonstrates leadership and integrity.
<b>Community Foundation General Scholarship</b>	Special consideration may be taken for underserved populations within the eligible scholarship pool.
<b>Corey Bakken Speech &amp; Debate Memorial Scholarship</b>	The Corey Bakken Memorial Scholarship is offered to students graduating from District 318 who have earned a GPA of 3.00 or higher; who plan to attend a Community College or 4-year College pursuing a degree in Speech and Debate (or possibly a degree in Economics, Finance or Law).
<b>Dan Retka Memorial Scholarship</b>	Must be graduating from GRHS and planning to enroll in a four-year university or college, studying engineering, construction management or environmental science and have at least a 3.0 GPA.
<b>Dede Emerson Scholarship</b>	For a Grand Rapids High School senior enrolled in a two-year or four-year college, specifically pursuing a major in international business, veterinarian work or music. Applications with a GPA of less than 3.0 will not be accepted.
<b>Dr. and Mrs. Robert Kelly Scholarship</b>	To support an individual pursuing an education in a health science field; ideally for a student who has had a break in their education and is going back to school to further their education in health care.
<b>Dr. Jules &amp; Ilo Meyer Medical Scholarship</b>	To support students entering the medical profession by attending one of the following: Medical School, a Registered Nursing program, Dental School or Veterinarian School. This scholarship does not support students attending Chiropractic School.
<b>Eagle Scholarship</b>	For students attending a Christian-centered, faith based college, university, Bible College, or seminary.
<b>Ed &amp; Eleanore Gregerson Scholarship</b>	Must be a graduating senior from Grand Rapids Senior High School, a member of Zion Lutheran church in Grand Rapids, MN and provide an essay about how personal faith has made an impact on your life.
<b>Edgar and Bess Mullins Scholarship</b>	Recipient selection is determined by the Greenway faculty and principal, recognizing one male and one female from the graduating class who demonstrate athletic involvement, scholarship, leadership, citizenship, and a well-rounded interest in community and school.
<b>Erling &amp; Fran Willadson Scholarship</b>	Students interested in applying for this scholarship must be planning to attend a vocational or technical school program.
<b>Frances Bartos King - James E King Scholarship</b>	To provide higher education for female graduates of the high schools in Itasca Area. This scholarship may be used for any educational field or endeavor with the exception of any form of religious education, training or activities.

<b>Freestone Community Club Scholarship</b>	1. Student must be graduating from High School with at least a 2.0 GPA. 2. One scholarship may be awarded to a male, and one scholarship may be awarded to a female. 3. Priority is given to students who live in the Arbo (56-25), Bass Lake (56-26), Deer Lake (56-27) or Wabana (57-25) townships.
<b>Gary Ehalt "His Love For Animals" Veterinary Scholarship</b>	For a student planning to attend Veterinary School. Any applicant who has graduated from a Greater Itasca Area High School is encouraged to apply. Graduates from Hill City High School may get priority.
<b>G.J. Holt Family Scholarship</b>	Must be a graduating senior from Bigfork High School and planning to attend a post-secondary institution.
<b>Grand Itasca Clinic &amp; Hospital Volunteer Services Scholarship</b>	Must have completed high school plus one year of college and be committed to study in the field of health care. At least two (2) letters of recommendation from teachers and/or employees are required.
<b>Grand Itasca Foundation Scholarship</b>	Pursuing a career in the field of health care. A personal interview is required for this scholarship.
<b>Grand Rapids AAUW Anniversary Scholarship</b>	AAUW knows that equity is still an issue and believes that education is a gateway to economic security. The Anniversary Scholarship was established and is supported to bring viable and visible life to that belief.
<b>Grand Rapids/Greenway Swimming Association Scholarship</b>	Must have a minimum 2.5 accumulative GPA and have participated in at least three (3) years of competitive swimming programs; preferably at the varsity level. Include a brief essay (250 – 500 words) that discusses how swimming has impacted your life.
<b>GRHS Class of 1966 Forrest L. Willey Memorial Scholarship</b>	Provides two scholarships, one to a Grand Rapids and one to a Northern Lights Community School graduate. This is an opportunity-centered award, referencing applicants who have fewer scholarship opportunities than most students.
<b>GRHS Class of 1985 Legacy Scholarship</b>	Applicants can be any age, graduated from Grand Rapids High School, attend any type of educational training or schooling. This is an opportunity-centered award, Applicants must submit an essay.
<b>GRSB Financial Focus Scholarship</b>	Must have a minimum GPA of 2.5, attending a four year or two year college or university and going into a Finance/business related field.
<b>Greater Itasca STEM</b>	For students pursuing education in the field of science, technology, engineering and/or math. Past recipients seeking scholarship support for additional years need to explain, show or demonstrate advancement in their educational and/or other goals in the application.
<b>Greater Itasca VoTech/Community College</b>	To support students of the Greater Itasca Area who intend to attend a community college, vocational, or technical institution. Past recipients seeking scholarship support for additional years need to explain, show or demonstrate advancement in their educational and/or other goals in the application.

<b>Greenway Spanish</b>	Offered to a graduating senior from Greenway High School who successfully passed (or is currently enrolled in) the Spanish III course. Successful candidates display a love for the language, utilizing Spanish in and out of the classroom setting.
<b>Harvey and Doris Dahline Wrestling Scholarship</b>	This scholarship supports a student graduating from Grand Rapids High School and a member of the GRHS Wrestling Team in good standing.
<b>Hazel Brink Music Scholarship</b>	Supports students who major in music.
<b>Hill City Area Community Scholarship</b>	Applicant must be a Hill City High School student.
<b>Hill City Classmates Memorial Scholarship Fund</b>	The Hill City Classmates Memorial Scholarship Fund is established as a memorial to students who graduated from Hill City High School. As a tribute, scholarships are awarded each year to one or more Hill City High School graduates. A Legacy list is presented to each recipient, and memorials are added as needed.
<b>J.W. Kumpula Scholarship</b>	For a Nashwauk – Keewatin High School senior who is planning to pursue a technical career in any field (except computer technology-related areas). This scholarship is geared more toward a well-rounded student with some financial need or ability to overcome barriers, rather than top GPA.
<b>Jack Gunderson Memorial Scholarship</b>	Student graduating from Deer River High School. Community and school involvement is highly scored and considered.
<b>Jan Ferraro Memorial Scholarship</b>	Offered to graduates of Hill City High School who are not eligible for a Pell Grant.
<b>Jeff Davies Scholarship for the Arts</b>	Supports students pursuing study in the Arts at ICC.
<b>Jennifer Koprowski Scholarship</b>	For a GRHS college-bound senior female swimmer who has shown dedication to the sport and leadership ability.
<b>John and Carol Setterberg Memorial Scholarship</b>	One male and one female student at Deer River High School with high academic achievement (GPA greater than 3.5/4.0) and record of participation in sports.
<b>John and Frances Furlong Scholarship</b>	Recipients will be the applicants with the highest GPA who are enrolled in a post-secondary technical training program. Technical or vocational training is defined as training which does not lead to a bachelor's degree.
<b>Judy Peura Hultquist Scholarship</b>	This scholarship is for high school students graduating from Hill City High School.
<b>K. Roger Betz Vocational School Scholarship</b>	This scholarship is intended for a student graduating from Greenway High School with an intention of going to a two-year vocational/technical school.
<b>Keith Newstrom Memorial Aviation Scholarship</b>	Pursuing a career in aviation. This scholarship may be used for aviation related education or flight hours. Recipients are limited to one, \$2,500 scholarship and must attend an approved and accredited program.

<b>Latterell Family Scholarship</b>	A graduate of Bigfork High School who is planning to attend a four-year public or private college or university (not vocational school). The top three students in the class are not eligible for this award.	
<b>Lavona M. Jasper Scholarship</b>	For a graduating senior from Greenway High School planning to major in education. A minimum grade point average of 3.0 is required. Include an essay about: "What Qualities Do I Have that Make Me a Good Educator?"	
<b>Lilah Maddy Brandon Scholarship</b>	For a male or female graduating senior from GRHS based on need.	
<b>Lou and Mary Alice Barle Memorial Scholarship</b>	Applicant must have been involved in sports at Greenway and supply verification of athletic involvement, including teams and years with their application.	
<b>Max Fulton Forestry Scholarship</b>	For a student who is planning to major in Forestry at a 2 or 4 year college or university.	
<b>MDI Success at Work Scholarship</b>	Intended mainly to help students transition from high school to work. Priority may be given to students needing specific support to overcome physical or other barriers. Must have an IEP or involved in Special Education.	
<b>Mel and Nancy Kooda Memorial Scholarship</b>	For a student graduating McGregor High School entering an "industrial arts" field of study to include any of the Trades, certifications, teaching, education, nursing and medical.	
<b>Melvin &amp; Lucille Beier Family Scholarship</b>	Successful candidates will provide a discussion in the scholarship application about his/her family and financial situation. A thoughtful description about the reason you are seeking more education is also important to include in the application.	
<b>Mike Washburn Memorial Scholarship Fund</b>	The Mike Washburn Memorial Scholarship provides support for a graduate from Hill City High School who want to pursue education, training or certification to operate heavy equipment.	
<b>Mockford Scholarship</b>	This fund provides scholarships that are sponsored by the Minnesota DNR Forestry Employees' Association (FEA).	
<b>Myles Reif Memorial Scholarship</b>	For a senior from the Grand Rapids High School based on scholastic achievement and character, without regard to need, who pursues a degree in the Sciences.	
<b>Nashwauk Area Community Fund Scholarship</b>	Must be graduating from Nashwauk-Keewatin High School	
<b>Nicole Calgaro Memorial Scholarship</b>	Established for a senior from Nashwauk - Keewatin High School who is preferably (but not necessarily) interested in the music field. Award consideration may be taken for students involved in 4H.	
<b>Northern Minnesota Builders' Association Scholarship</b>	The purpose of the Northern Minnesota Builders' Association scholarship is to foster the building trade's future in Northern Minnesota by providing financial assistance for students pursuing a career in this field.	
<b>Northland Scholarship Fund</b>	Recipient/s must be graduating from Northland High School. This scholarship is a reoccurring award with a total value of \$3,000 over 4 years.	

<b>Peterson-Menefee Scholarship</b>	This is for applicants who live in Good Hope, Max, Third River, Moose Park, Alwood, Kinghurst, Ardenhurst or Grattan Townships who are pursuing post-secondary education.
<b>Rae Graham Scholarship</b>	2 graduating seniors from Greenway High School: one who is planning to major in education at a 2 or 4 year college or university and one pursuing a 2-year technical degree or certification through a VoTech or Community College. The applicant must be in the top 50% of the graduating class.
<b>Reif Dance Company Scholarship</b>	Must be a member of Reif Dance.
<b>Richard and Elaine Aune Music Scholarship</b>	Established to support a graduating senior from GRHS or Bigfork High school who is planning to study music. Preference is given to the study of choral music.
<b>Robert &amp; Shirley Bennett Scholarship</b>	The Robert & Shirley Bennett Physics Scholarship supports students who study physics.
<b>Ruth Hurlbert Scholarship</b>	This scholarship is for applicants to the Oak Hills Bible College in Bemidji, Minnesota.
<b>Scott A. Olson Memorial Scholarship</b>	This is a scholarship awarded to a student who is graduating or graduated from either Grand Rapids or Greenway high schools.
<b>St. John's Catholic Church of Hill City Scholarship</b>	Any student who has (or who's family has) attended St. John's Catholic Parish in Hill City. Family includes parents, grandparents, other. Preference to graduating seniors from Hill City HS.
<b>Steven Pietila Memorial Scholarship</b>	For a graduating Deer River High School senior with a GPA of 3.25 or higher. Applicant must express their involvement in community and extracurricular activities.
<b>Sulo Herrala Scholarship</b>	Awarded to a Bigfork senior with a "B" grade point average (3.0) or higher who is planning to attend a post-secondary institution as a full time student at a four-year college or vocational school.
<b>Sydney Gray - Forest Lake Elementary Scholarship</b>	To support students who attended Forest Lake Elementary School. Top ranking academic students are not eligible for this award.
<b>Terry &amp; Muggs Matteson L&amp;M Appreciation Scholarship</b>	Supports active L&M employees and immediate family members planning to attend a MN or WI school interested in furthering or continuing his/her education and/or training. Past recipients who are awarded any additional scholarship must maintain a minimum GPA.
<b>Truman &amp; Borghild "Bud" Shoaff Family Memorial Scholarship</b>	STEM, Recommendations, Essay: "Reasons for interest in Music or STEM". Where your passions came from and where you want your passions to lead you.
<b>Turna E. Fletcher Scholarship</b>	For a graduating senior in pursuit of an elementary education degree as well. An interest in improving the environment is an additional factor.
<b>Wade and Barbara (Danielson) Salisbury Family Scholarship</b>	Must be a graduating senior of Deer River High School, based on good character, hard work and need.

<b>Workforce Ready</b>	Recipients must want to live here, work here and stay here and have 2 years or less of education or training.	
<b>Zack Adams Memorial Scholarship</b>	The Greenway recipient may attend any qualified vocational, technical or certification program. Priority may be given to a student who plans on attending Alexandria Tech.
